2021 HIGHLIGHTS

COLLEGE FOR WEST VIRGINIA UNVEILED

Over the summer, West Virginia's central higher education office unveiled "College for West Virginia" as a new and expanded resource for West Virginians planning for postsecondary education. This expansion represents a rebrand of CFWV.com, the state's college- and career-planning web portal previously known as the College Foundation of West



Virginia, and the launch of its sister site, **CollegeforWV.com**, which is focused on state-sponsored financial aid programs that total more than \$100 million in scholarships and grants for West Virginians each year. Together, these sites redefine CFWV as "College for West Virginia," home to the state's free resources for planning, applying, and paying for college.

GEAR UP GRANT

In October, the Higher Education Policy Commission announced that it received a \$24.5 million grant from the U.S. Department of Education to support college-planning and readiness services for more than 17,500 middle and high school students over the next seven years. This marks the fourth time West Virginia has received a "Gaining Early Awareness and Readiness for Undergraduate



Programs" (GEAR UP) grant, and the third consecutive time it has been awarded to the Commission. Under this new award, West Virginia GEAR UP will continue to stress the importance of earning a trade certificate, two-year degree or four-year degree after high school and provide students with resources to prepare for and succeed in college.

OPEN LEARNING WV

"The COVID-19 pandemic underscored the need to make learning materials more easily accessible..." Early this year, the state higher education office launched a program, "Open Learning WV," that gives faculty the opportunity to implement Open Educational Resources (OER) as alternatives to traditional textbooks for their students. The COVID-19 pandemic underscored the need to make learning materials more easily accessible, but even before that, in 2019, the Legislature passed legislation that encourages the use of OER - materials that live in the public domain or are otherwise released under an open license that allow for low-cost and easy access to students – as a strategy to reduce the financial burden on students. Based on Spring and Summer 2021 course enrollments and the cost of course materials before OER implementation, students experienced an aggregate savings of over \$250,000 in one semester - over a quarter of a million dollars. This savings comes with only 41 faculty creating or adopting OER in 44 separate courses in two semesters - and these numbers continue to grow.



WV VACS TEAM

In April, more than 1,000 health professional students from colleges and universities across the state volunteered to administer vaccines in coordination with local health departments and community health partners. This initiative – the West Virginia Vaccine Administration, Collaboration, and Support (WV VACS) Team – resulted from a partnership among the



National Guard, Department of Health and Human Resources, and Higher Education Policy Commission. The effort was recognized in October with the 2021 George E. Thibault Nexus Award from the Association of Schools Advancing Health Professions, which celebrates stand-out interprofessional collaboration and those who are working innovatively where practice and education connect in health systems.

MENTAL HEALTH GRANTS

In August, the central higher education office awarded nearly \$60,000 in grants to improve student mental health at colleges and universities across the state. This year's Campus Mental Health Grants supported 12 projects, including a virtual peer support app, suicide prevention and crisis intervention training for faculty and students, increased availability of mental health and wellness presentations for students, and the creation of wellness and meditation spaces on campuses. Institutions are encouraged to partner with campus and communitybased resources to increase the reach of their projects. The 2021 WEST VIRGINIA HIGHER EDUCATION ALMANAC provides year-end higher education statistics for both of the state's higher education systems, the West Virginia Higher Education Policy Commission (Commission) and West Virginia Council for Community and Technical College Education (Council).

When reviewing the statistics in this report, it is important to carefully consider the data definitions for each metric, which are found at the end of the document. This is particularly important when it comes to the cohort, or group of students, of which the statistic is reflective. For example, there are fundamental differences between "full-time" and "part-time" students that can have a drastic effect on the reported data.


