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Course Description	Students should be able to use a computer and have a firm understanding of file management concepts in windows. This course will provide students with basic knowledge of digital video/media editing. Students will learn in a hands-on environment various editing technique for editing raw video into a finished work. The course will provide an understanding for the following: video camera basics, lighting techniques, editing software that can be used on home computers, green screen effects, storyboarding, creative commons licensing, use of background music to affect mood and using stock video footage.
